Who should be on an Academic Improvement Plan (AIP)?

- All students who were retained must have a Promotion/Retention Contract (PRC) in CUM
- All students who were recommended for retention but parents signed a refusal of retention must have a PRC
- All students not proficient on NMSBA in one or more content standards
- Any student not functioning at grade level and meets one or more of the criteria below:
 - o Student is in a reader that is not on grade level based on the DRA
 - o Is at-risk in reading or math on Discovery scores
- If a student is border line, write an AIP. It is easier to dismiss them later than to add a student toward the end of the year.

Who should go to the Student Assistance Team?

- Students that were retained and not making gains should be monitored and taken to SAT for review/recommendations.
- Students are not making progress after 9-18 weeks of intervention and progress monitoring
- Students that you are considering for retention (SAT may recommend additional time vs. testing)

*Remember parents may refuse retention the first year. If a refusal was signed in the previous year, the student will automatically be retained if he/she is not at grade level. You must create a new PRC. If the student is borderline, consult the principal/assistant principal. With approval, these students may wait for final review until early May.

ALL STUDENTS ON AIP MUST COMPLETE THE AIP EACH YEAR. IF SKILLS ARE NOT MASTERED OR A
STUDENT IS FUNCTIONING SIX MONTHS OR MORE BELOW GRADE LEVEL, THE STUDENT MUST ALSO
HAVE A PROMOTION/RETENTION CONTRACT BEFORE THE END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR. A NEW AIP WILL
BE WRITTEN AT THE START OF THE NEXT YEAR.
